Begin Petition

Dear Mayor and Members of Alexandria City Council,

I support City Council enacting immediate changes to reduce the discriminatory tax burden on restaurants. I recognize that local restaurants are the backbone of our community, employing citizens from all walks of life, improving streetscapes, and adding to the attractiveness and vibrancy of the City. Restaurants should not be targeted, distinct from every other business, as a special source for City revenue.

Expanding affordable housing is a worthy goal, but there are ways to do so without new taxes – and there are ways to raise tax revenue that do not unduly burden a single industry. Further, the meals tax disproportionately hits low income families who spend a larger percentage of their budget on meals. It also leaves restaurateurs with less money to hire employees and grow their businesses.

As such, I urge City Council to immediately:

1. REPEAL THE RECENT 1% MEALS TAX INCREASE. This increase makes Alexandria the most expensive dining destination in the DMV region, with a combined meals and sales tax of 11%.

2. PROVIDE A 3% REBATE ON ALL MEALS TAX REVENUES COLLECTED BY RESTAURANTS AND PASSED THROUGH TO THE CITY OF ALEXANDRIA.

Restaurants currently pay credit card fees in order to collect taxes for the City.

- 3. REDUCE THE PENALTY FOR LATE PAYMENT OF MEALS TAX TO THE CITY AND INTRODUCE A REASONABLE GRACE PERIOD BEFORE A PENALTY IS IMPOSED. Today, restaurants immediately pay an egregious 10% late penalty.
- **4. HOLD A PUBLIC HEARING BEFORE ANY TAX INCREASE IS CONSIDERED AND AGAIN AFTER THE ADD/DELETE PROCESS (PRIOR TO ADOPTING ANY BUDGET OR ORDINANCE).** The current process provides inadequate notice to affected parties and no clear means for recourse.

By making these changes, you will send a signal that Alexandria is a place where new businesses should locate, existing businesses should grow, and diners should visit.

Petition Comments:

Adding this on top of the existing difficulties businesses face is unfair, as well as poor planning Alexandria is already expensive and increasing the taxes would make the dining experiences in Alexandria further from being affordable to average income earners.

Alexandria should also require that no tax increase may take effect unless approved by referendum.

Alexandria should seek to be the region's lowest tax destination, not the highest. If Affordable Housing is our new priority, then the city should cut other programs to pay for it. Have discipline. an increase in meal tax would be devastating for City of Alexandria restaurants. It has been already difficult to compete with NHB, The Wharf and Fairfax county restaurants. An increase in meal tax will make it even more difficult

As a 15-year Alexandria resident, I'm increasingly perplexed by our Council's inability to work within the constraints of their own budget without treating local restaurants as an emergency revenue stream. I'm galled by recent remarks made by certain council members, particularly Mr. Bailey, indicating he is apathetic to the needs of Alexandria's workforce, has no regard for those who weren't born and bred in the City, and possesses little understanding of how individual economic decisions are made. Finally, I'm infuriated at the stealthy tactics that were employed to implement this tax. This tax needs to be repealed and related actions rectified immediately. Rest assured that this issue will strongly affect my vote in the primary on June 12 as well as the November election.

As a provider of business services in the food and beverage industry I understand how lean the margins are for restaurants. This tax is short-sighted, and demonstrates poor economic understanding and poor governance.

As a successful retailer in Old Town with two businesses I need quality restaurants in my business ecosystem in order to survive. If you make it even more expensive to live, work, and do business in town you will lose people - visitors, qualified employees, visitors, new residents, and new businesses like NSF or HQ2 - instead of adding much needed economic development.

Breaking bread is an ancient tradition of peace of friendship. It is what we do to celebrate and also to mourn those we have lost. Dining out in Alexandria is the main reason many people come to Alexandria. They shop at our unique stores during their visits as well as visit our historic sites. The restaurants in Alexandria have been a main reason people come to our town. Additionally, the restaurateurs are continually and exceptionately generous in donating food to Alexandria nonprofits. To tax them further makes no good sense and risks losing the very significant good they do for our community.

City should find an alternative to affordable housing and not tax business.

Do not increase the tax

Do not raise taxes on anything! This does nothing but stifle business. As a small business owner we

want to encourage more people to come to Alexandria NOT give them a reason to stay away!

Don't ruin Alexandria's future with excessive taxation on small businesses.

I am totally against this increase on tax in Alexandria, as a leader in Business and as a local living in the area.

I believe we should expand affordable housing but not at the expense of restaurants. It's the wrong place to turn for the revenue -- why not get it from the real estate tax which is related to housing????? It makes no sense. The Council made some bad decisions/deals about affordable housing units in the 2000s but restaurants shouldn't be penalized for their bad decisions. That singles out one group to pay the price -- a group that is least likely to be able to afford it. Are you rebating the credit card fees?????

I do support items 1, 3 and 4 above and feel that this meals tax increase requires additional research and consideration. I am generally not in favor of singling out one group of individuals for differential treatment. Please reconsider the meals tax as it is currently structured and enacted.

I don't understand how penalizing residents who want to eat at the many restaurants in Alexandria makes sense.

I have supported Alexandria for 12 years, we chose to have our business here. But we, as restaurants, have to comply with so many hoops that would make one think the city isn't interested in having our businesses here. Now this!?
